Essay Competition - Terms and Conditions

Back to the Competition Page Eligibility:

- This essay competition is open to current law students at accredited educational institutions, and those that may have completed their studies but are still searching for pupillage and are a member of an Inn
- Entrants must be able to provide valid proof of their student status, such as a copy of their student ID, a copy of their Inn ID or an official letter from their educational institution.
- Employees, affiliates, and immediate family members of the organisers and judges of the Competition are not eligible to participate.

Entry Requirements:

- To enter the Competition, participants must submit an essay that complies with the essay guidelines.
- Only one entry is allowed per participant.

Essay Guidance:

Essays must adhere to the following guidelines:

- The essay must be written in English.
- The essay should not exceed 1,000 words, excluding citations, sources, and references.
- Entrants should include citations and references in accordance with Practice Direction (Citation of Authorities) [2012] 1 WLR 780.
- The essay must not include the entrant's name, contact information, or any identifying information within the document itself. All identifying information should be provided separately during the submission process.

Submission Process:

- All entries must be submitted electronically through the 4PB website by 11:59pm on 6th April 2025.
- Entrants must provide their name, contact information, educational institution, and proof of student status in a separate cover letter or submission form. This information will be kept confidential and will not be visible to the judges during the evaluation process.

Evaluation and Judging:

Essays will be evaluated based on the following criteria:

- Originality of ideas
- Clarity, coherence and impact of writing
- Relevance to the competition's theme or topic
- Proper citation and use of sources

A panel of qualified judges selected by the organisers will review and score the essays anonymously.

The decision of the judges is final and binding.

Awards:

The judging panel will select one essay as the winning entry and up to two additional essays as the runner(s)-up.

The Essay Competition winner will be awarded:

- A £500 monetary prize.
- An invitation for a mini-pupillage
- An invitation to the 4PB International Seminar on Thursday 26th June 2026
- The winning essay will also be published in the New Law Journal

The Essay(s) selected as a top entry will receive:

- A £250 monetary prize
- An invitation to the 4PB International Seminar on Thursday 26th June 2026

All entrants will be invited to the reception at the 4PB International Seminar.

Payment of Monetary Prize and Consent for Bank Details:

- Monetary prizes will be paid by bank transfer.
- To receive the monetary prize, winners must provide their bank account details to the organisers. By participating in the competition, entrants consent to providing their bank account details for the purpose of receiving the prize.
- The organisers will handle all personal and financial information provided by winners in accordance with applicable privacy laws and regulations. This information will only be used for the purpose of prize disbursement and will not be shared with third parties without consent.

Copyright and Plagiarism:

- By submitting an essay to the Competition, entrants grant the organisers a non-exclusive licence to reproduce, publish, and distribute their work for promotional and educational purposes.
- Plagiarism will not be tolerated. All submitted essays will be checked for originality, and any essay found to contain plagiarised content will be disqualified.
- Entries prepared with the aid of artificial intelligence will be disqualified.

Announcement of the Winning Entry and Top Entries:

 Authors of the winning entry and top entries will be notified via the contact information provided during submission. The results will also be posted on the Competition Website/Platform and through other communication channels chosen by the organisers.

Privacy and Personal Data

- The organisers will handle all personal information in accordance with the <u>4PB Privacy Notice</u>.
- Personal information will only be used for the purposes of the Competition and will not be shared with third parties without consent.
